Len, the seventh and youngest son of Felix and Julianna, was born March 4, 1923. Whether or not he was born on the homestead I am not sure. In the same year, Ted was hospitalized at St. Elizabeth's Hospital with osteomyelitis in one of the bones of one of his legs. Catherine was rushed to the same hospital; diagnosed with ruptured appendix. She had surgery and after an arduous and lengthy recovery period she went home. Ted succumbed to his illness and was buried at Holy Guardian Angels Cemetery at Englefeld.

Like the rest of his brothers and sisters he walked the three miles to Korbel School. After his older brothers and sisters "struck out on their own" he, Ben and Clara worked the farm with the help of their father who in 1927, had suffered a stroke. The stroke had left him with some paralysis of an arm and a leg. Following Catherine's marriage in 1936 to Frank Therres, the Regenwetters and Frank shared machinery, horses and labor. Len was a hardworking fellow and when time permitted he worked for neighboring farmers. The "dirty-thirties" left farmers with poor weather, poor crops and little if any money. Opportunities for work were scarce, especially work that paid a wage.

I remember Uncle Len as a fellow who liked to tease me and play tricks on me. Aunt Catherine said she thought that was because I was a town kid. Maybe I was just gullible! To a small child, he was a grown up.

In 1941 when Catherine, Frank and their three children moved to the coast, Len went with them. According to Catherine, Len was glad to leave as he believed there would be more and better opportunities in BC. They traveled by train. He left behind his parents and, with the exception of Catherine, all of his brothers and sisters; a big move for an 18 year old. Initially he lived with Catherine and Frank.

Transportation was necessary in order to get a job so Len grubbed stumps in return for a motorcycle. Judging from the picture taken at the time, he was a proud owner. Now that transportation had been obtained, he was able to get employment at the Brick Yard in Sullivan. Soon Frank also got employment at the same place. The two would travel there and back on the motorcycle; Len driving, Frank on behind. When the Brick Yard laid him off, Len got a job in a saw mill. While working here, he suffered an eye injury either from a wood chip or a saw tooth. Except for light and dark, he had lost the vision in that eye. The doctor instructed him never to lower his head below the level of his shoulders. The reason for this is unclear but it did hamper his ability to work when he and Joe leased a strawberry farm that was owned by Japanese who were interned by the government due to the war with Japan. This was a seven acre farm with a house. By this time his parents, Clara, and Ben had arrived from Saskatchewan. This house became home for Joe, Ida, their two children, Clara, along with Len and his parents. Everyone worked on the farm. With the help of Catherine, day laborers were recruited to tend to and harvest the crop. Each day

laborers were transported to and from the farm by Len in a truck he'd gotten. Len would also move the strawberries to Royal City Slader and Stewart Canary. This work was compatible with the limitations imposed on him by his eye injury. Len traded in his motorcycle on a Model A Ford car.

The family was active in the local Roman Catholic Parish where Fr. Nash was the parish Priest. Len became president of the Catholic Youth Organization. Fr. Nash became a family friend and he became helpful in finding Clara a job at St. Mary's Hospital. Len bought a different car, a Terra Plain, and he gave his Model A to Fr. Nash because his car was laid up in the garage.

The strawberry season was drawing to a close. It was very hot on this July day in 1942. Len and some of his friends headed off to Bear Creek pool for a swim to cool off. This was the day Len's life ended when he failed to surface after dropping off a sharp ledge in the pool. He'd been walking out into the pool with a friend who was unable to swim. His failure to surface was a surprise to friends who'd witnessed the event because Len was able to swim. His body was recovered by a spectator and Fr. Nash called. The death certificate read "Cause unknown" as no water was found in his lungs.

St. Peter's Church was crowded as Fr. Nash read the funeral mass. Len was buried in St. Peter's Cemetery.

The last of Julianna and Felix's twelve children, Clara Ann, was born on August 31, 1925. She had four older sisters, Lena, Mary, Teresa and Catherine. Of her seven older brothers she would never know Ted and Louie as both died before she was born.

Her early years were spent on the homestead, attending school and helping her father and brothers Ben and Len, run the family farm. When she was only two years old, her father suffered a stroke which left him with some paralysis of one arm and leg, thus limiting the kind and amount of work he was able to do. Her help running the farm was needed as her older brothers and sisters left the home to establish their own lives; Frank left in 1927 to take his father to Texas to recuperate over the winter, he found work there and stayed, Hank married in 1928, Lena who'd accompanied Frank and

her father, married in 1929, Mary left in about 1928 to work for Mrs. Linda at the Englefeld Hotel and married in 1935, Joe married in 1933, Teresa left to obtain work, Catherine left in 1935 to work for Mr. and Mrs. Wesser and marry in 1937. This left Ben, Len and Clara to work the farm.

When Catherine and Frankie Therres moved to BC in 1941, Len went with them. Her father along with Joe, Ida and their two children drove out to BC that same summer. This left Julianna, Clara, and Ben to follow in late fall. By the time they arrived, Joe and Len had leased a strawberry farm which also had a house on the property. Felix, Julianna, Joe, Ida, their two children, Len and Clara moved into the house. I'm unsure of whether or not Ben lived there also. Everyone worked on the strawberry farm along with Catherine.

Prior to the arrival of the last of his family members to come, Len had become friends with Fr. Nash, the parish priest. Eventually Fr. Nash found employment for Clara at St. Mary's Hospital in New Westminster. She was still employed there when in March 1943 when her mother died in St. Mary's Hospital.

Sometime after Julianna's death, Clara returned to Saskatchewan and was employed by Mrs. Linda at the Englefeld Hotel. While working there she became a close and lifelong friend of Mrs. Linda's youngest daughter, Thelma. Later when Clara's own first daughter was born she was named Thelma Ann.

It is from this period of time that I have recollections of my Aunt Clara. The "Hotel" was less than what is now known as a block away from our home so Aunt Clara was frequently at our home. My mother, Mary, had also worked at the "Hotel" prior to

her marriage and the friendship between Mrs. Linda and her daughters had remained so we were frequently at the "hotel". I know that as children we dropped in often usually without any other purpose than to see what was happening and sometimes we'd buy a treat. I considered Aunt Clara to be a very stylish woman. Once I'd seen a studio portrait of her wearing a lace collar and her hair "done up" in little curls all over her head and her nails "frenched". I recall begging her to recreate this look. She patiently explained that the "hair-do" wasn't suitable for work and that she wouldn't be able to do dishes with her nails "frenched". This explanation didn't stop me from asking. Aunt Clara had her tonsils out during this time and while recovering stayed with us. I rather doubt that she was very appreciative of the annoying child that kept asking why she couldn't talk or why she got Jell-O to eat. This was also the era of community dances held at the local hall. I remember one time when Aunt Clara was fixing her hair and putting on make-up while I stood on one leg staring at her. I'd been to wedding dances with my parents but I'd not been to one of these all adult affairs and I desperately wanted to get dressed up and go the dance, too.

Mar and I made our confirmation while Aunt Clara was in Englefeld. Mar chose Aunt Clara as her confirmation sponsor while I chose her best friend, Thelma, as mine. For my confirmation name I chose Ann, Aunt Clara's middle name. We each received a silver chain with a Star of David medallion.

Some time after that, in 1947, we received the exciting news that Aunt Teresa, Uncle Charles, and Bubbles were coming for a visit. At the end of this visit Aunt Clara accompanied them back to the USA.

While working with Teresa and Charles at a roadhouse/nightclub in Star Idaho, she met the man she would marry, Herbert Clayton Kennedy, the cook. They remained in Idaho and their first


child was born there. Thelma Ann was born in Onterio, Idaho on May 25, 1950. Their second daughter, Julie Kay, may have also been born there sometime in 1952.

Prior to 1957, the family moved to Oklahoma. When Mom traveled by bus to Oklahoma in 1957 they were living in Okmulgee, Oklahoma. Mom made the trip to visit her brother, Frank, whose health was failing as the result of cancer. Pictures show the family reunion as Aunt Teresa was there also. Six years later, in 1963, Mom returned to Okmulgee. This time Keith and I went with her and this time rather than a bus trip, we drove down. This would turn out to be our last visit with Clara and Herb.

One of my most enduring memories of that visit is of Aunt Clara frying corn meal breaded okra. I'd developed a passion for this dish and would eat it at every available opportunity. Herb was a terrific guide and Aunt Clara would join us on our sight seeing tours when she was off duty from the Bell Glass company. One of our tours took us to Oklahoma City where we visited Uncle Frank's gravesite and also to spend the afternoon with Ethel, his widow. Thelma and Julie were about 13 and 11 respectively. They had their long hair cut while we were there and we had a lot of fun trying different hair styles.

Sometime between 1963 and 1966 Clara and Herb divorced and Clara married Bill Brown in 1966. Julie and Thelma remained with their mother and Bill. In the intervening years Clara was diagnosed with cancer and as I recall, received cancer treatment at a Cancer Clinic in Texas. The interventions were unsuccessful and cancer claimed her life when at the age of 53, in 1978, she died.






The girl in this photograph was originally identified as Julianna Gruendl, however the information on the reverse (right) contradicts this.

The picture was taken by the studio of Otto Böhm, previously named Emile Wangemann, photographer of the court. Everything on the reverse is exclusively in relation with the Studio. Above left side: Medal of award at an Expostion in Nürnberg in 1896 for very good picture, portraits and landscape. Above right: the studio received a prize at an exposition in Freiburg in 1897. Second on the left (Höchste...): Highest honorable mention from her highness the Prince Ludwig of Bayern and Archduke Ferdinand and Grandduke of Toskana ...for the photographer! Last two lines: If you want a copy, you can have it at any time. Enlargement of every picture.

It would seem unlikely for the picture to have been taken prior to 1897. Since Julianna had been in the US since 1895, it would also seem unlikely for it to be her unless she made a return trip to Europe after 1897. Is it her? Another family member? One possibility could be that the photographer used an earlier image of her to create this for advertising purposes.


Letter from a school friend to Julia when Julia had been married 10 years.

16-08-1928 My dear niece Julia

I heard from my sister Elizabeth that your mother told her that my brother George was together with your father. It appears that your father died but I don't know when or where. I beg you Julia to write to me if you can clear up this situation. I had no peace because I don't know if my brother lives or how he is. I wrote to the consulate in Argentina but there they do not know anything about him.

I also wrote a registered letter to your Uncle Johann Gruendl without an answer. Now I turn to you. Please be so kind and write to me and tell me what you know. Maybe I gets to know how my brother is. I would be very grateful to you.

Dear Julia, how are you after all? I hope you are very well. How is your big family? How is your sister Lisl? Is she married? Please write me a long extensive letter. I wait for it in great longing. I hope that he can still remember me. Remember your uncle Josef who bought the white dress for your First Holy Communion. I will close now in the sure hope to hear from you in the very soon

(translation of preceding letter)

February 17, 1930

My dear niece Julie and relatives:

We have waited a full year for the promised pictures and letters from you without success. Why? I was looking forward to them so much. We let all our relatives read your letter from 1929 but I believe none of them have written to you because none of them have an interest in it. At first I have sad news to tell you. On the 9th of January your Uncle Alois died. He was still working on New Year's Eve, but in that night he fell sick and never recovered. He leaves behind a widow with 6 children. Christmas 1928 we celebrated their silver wedding anniversary.Doris' (?) eldest daughter Zanzi married one year ago......their second daughter Maria is in Pirmasenz in Holle.....their son, 22 years old is a blacksmith and still at home.....Their daughter Emma is 20 years old, Bertha is 17 years old and last in the row, Josef is 15 years old.

She has her own house in Neufahron near Poing and 6 acres(tagewerk) of land. A shame about my brother, he was my favorite one.

Uncle Hans is in Straubing in a senior's home to be looked after. His 2 sons robbed him of all his money. This old sick father who has only one leg - they deserted him. Your Auntie Susi lost her husband two years ago and lost her only son in the war. She had only 2 children. The daughter died at the age of 9. She lives up in the Castle Rhebrg that was where her husband worked as a carpenter.

Your auntie Maria has been stricken with rheumatism 8 years ago. She can barely walk and where we sit her down, there she must stay. They still live in Chigen/in (Chigen on the River). Her oldest son George died in the war. Three daughters are married, all the other children are still at home. There were also a goodish amount of children and now there are grandchildren coming this way, the house is never empty.

Your Uncle Peter lives in Graz and is a forester. He has 2 sons, both in the forestry business. The oldest is married and has 2 children. The youngest is still at home.

Your Uncle Martin lives in Neu Otting. He lost his wife through death and also a son in the war. His daughter Resi is married in Neu Otting. Uncle married a second time and she had a son aged 22. So my dear Julia, now you know about your Uncles and Aunts (the most important things).

About us, I can tell you that we married in 1899. We have 3 children. Our oldest daughter, Josefa is 32 years old and has been married for 6 years to a Senior Security Officer. She is well and has no children. Our son Willie is 30 years old and still single. He is a _____ and he travels around the world. We have been waiting since Christmas for him to visit us but at the moment he is in Rome.

8) Regenwetter Reunions

The first "unofficial" reunion was held on July 13, 1986 in British Columbia. It was the year of Expo. Catherine, Theresa, Kathleen, and family would be visiting with Catherine's daughter Sharon. The story has it that Catherine send a letter to Marlene and Denny that she and Theresa would be visiting in BC. Denny purchased plane tickets and then advised Marlene that they were going on a trip to visit with the Aunts. Once there, they discovered that Catherine had also notified Agnes who would also be attending. Catherine's wish was for a family get-together. Dorothy convinced Keith into flying. He arrived on the 12th as did Agnes. On Sunday the 13th the family got together at the home of Sharon and Harold Swift. Everyone departed on the 14th for their respective homes. Denny notes that "we weren't there for a long time, but we had a good time". Little did Catherine know that her plan for a "get-together" would spur family members on to hosting future family reunions on a much larger scale.

Around Christmas of 1986, mention of a family reunion to be hosted in Black Diamond was discussed. Thoughts and discussion went by the wayside until April 1991. At this time, Keith was attending a family thrown retirement party. It was decided that his "retirement project" would be to plan the next reunion. It was held at Black Diamond in 1993. This was the largest attended reunion of them all.

The third reunion was held at Buck Creek Alberta in 1996. Sources relay that it rained quite a bit and many of the activities had to be held indoors. A few photos are available of these so called "activities". Planning began for the "millennium" reunion to be held in Saskatchewan.

So here we are in the year 2000 celebrating our family's heritage. The location takes us back to the "roots of our family", at Englefeld Saskatchewan, a few miles from Romance, Saskatchewan where our memories begin. At this reunion, the memories will continue.
